Project Summary -

In April, 2016 the USYFFT, in collaboration with the Delta Program of the State College School District and National Trout Unlimited (Phil Thomas), began the process of planning and implementing a course of action to address the serious erosion and sedimentation problems that were identified In Thompson Run, an exceptional value stream in Centre County. With the help of Phil Thomas from National TU, plans were developed to construct various log and stone structures in the creek. The work was accomplished with significant numbers of volunteer students from the Delta Program of the State College Area School District, and the Pennsylvania State University as well as many adults. Over the 18 month period of the project all planned structures were successfully completed and the resultant reduction of sedimentation and enhanced bank stabilization became readily apparent. Multiple heavy storms resulting in flooding in the stream has not affected the stability of any of the structures.

Sustainability -

As noted in the Project Summary, the structures are extremely stable and will merely require planned future monitoring by John Ford, the project main contact, Jess Boyer, the project secondary contact and Phil Thomas from TU.

Centre County Conservation District - Plants were provided by the District and employees worked with the volunteers to plant and stabilize the riparian zones.

Pinnacle Erosion and Control - Provided equipment and manpower throughout the project.


Delta Program of the State College Area School District - Provided volunteer workers.
